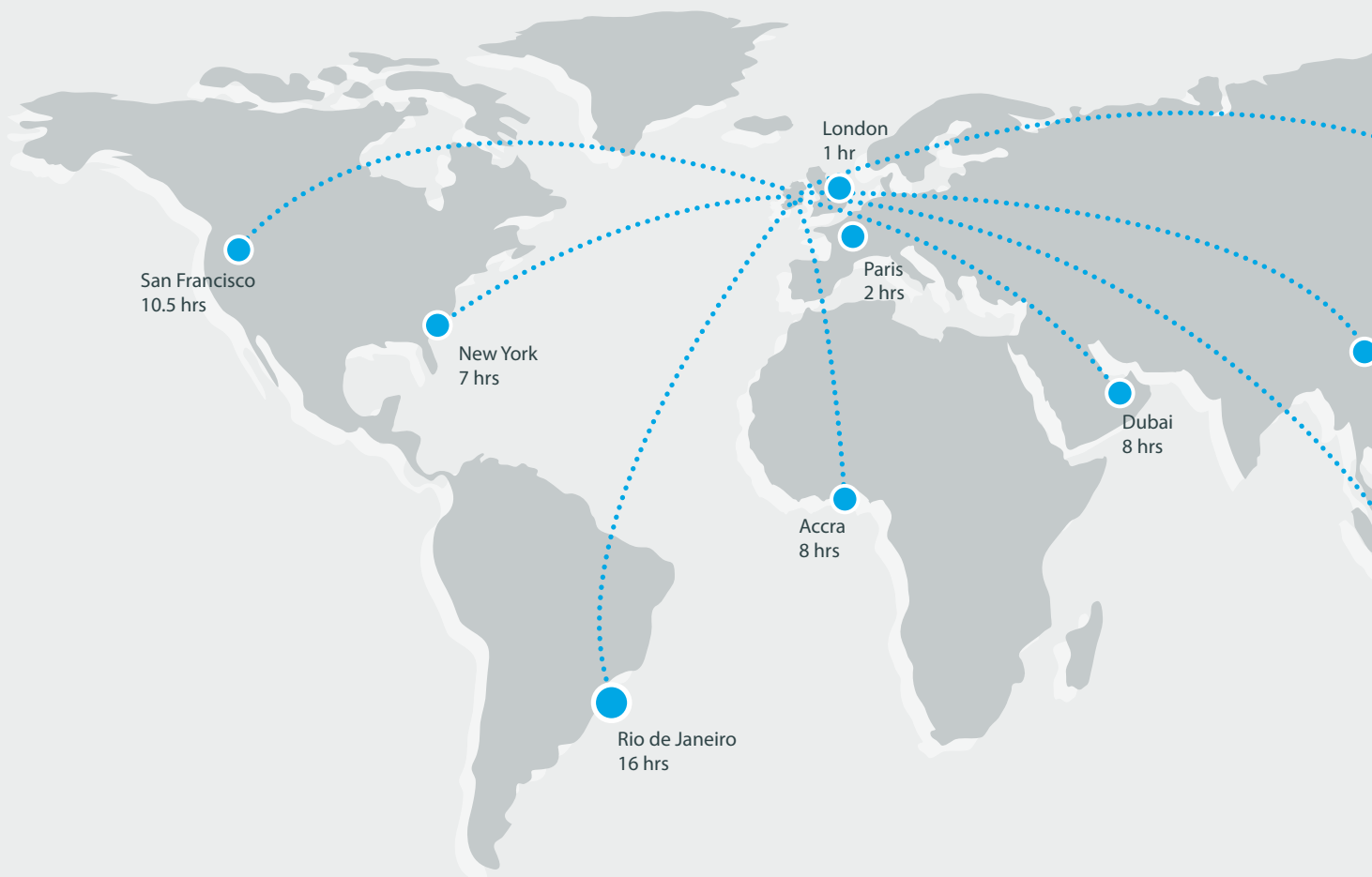
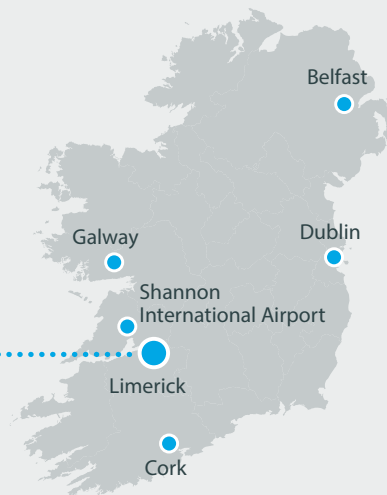
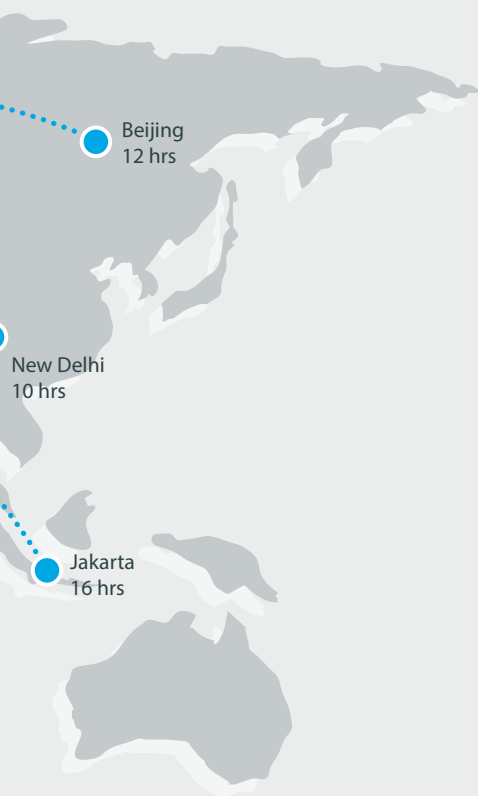

Graduate Employment

Achieving your potential at UL

With a graduate employment rate consistently higher than the national average, University of Limerick's graduates are highly sought after across all sectors of the economy. Over 96% of UL graduates secure employment or progress to further study within six months of graduation. UL's dedicated Career Services team empowers students to plan and pursue their career plans with confidence. Support includes:

Student Work Permits and Graduate Employment

International (non-EU/EEA) students are permitted to work part-time (up to 20 hours per week) during the academic semester, and full-time (up to 40 hours per week) during official holiday periods such as summer and Christmas breaks.

Graduates of UL also benefit from generous post-study work opportunities in Ireland:

- Bachelor's Degree (Level 8 Honours): Eligible to apply for a 12-month Graduate Stay Back Visa.
- Master's Degree (Level 9 or higher): Eligible to apply for a 24-month Graduate Stay Back Visa.

Application Process and Entry Requirements

Application Process

- Applications for 2026/27 open in mid-October 2025.
- Applications can be made on www.ul.ie directly from the programme webpage.
- Applications must be submitted by **1 July 2026** for September 2026 entry.*
- It is advisable to apply well in advance of 1 July to secure your place.
- The application processing time is approximately 14 - 21 working days (Note: processing times may vary depending on the time of year and the programme you are applying to).
- All applications must be accompanied by certification of all educational qualifications and certification demonstrating a high level of proficiency in English.
- Applicants who have not yet completed final exams or an English language test can receive a conditional offer by submitting predicted grades.
- There is a €50 application fee, and two programmes may be listed in order of preference.

** Please note that a small number of programmes have an earlier closing date. Always check the programme page for details.*

Entry Requirements

Undergraduate Entry Requirements

- Undergraduate candidates must obtain an educational qualification equivalent to the Irish Leaving Certificate.
- UL recognises and accepts a range of high school exams globally, including SATs and ACTs (American curriculum), A Levels (UK system), and the International Baccalaureate.

Postgraduate Entry Requirements

- Applicants must hold a qualification that is equivalent to an Irish or UK honours bachelor's degree (NFQ level 8).
- In many cases, the degree must be in a discipline relevant to the postgraduate degree sought.

Scholarships

Certificate in International Foundation Studies

This programme is managed by the University of Limerick Language Centre. It is a one-year full-time programme that offers international high school students an alternative route to undergraduate study.

It is suitable for international students who do not hold qualifications equivalent to the Irish Leaving Certificate or A-Level, and provides a comprehensive academic and English language foundation for undergraduate study.

There are three streams:

- Foundation in Science & Engineering
- Foundation in Arts, Law & Humanities
- Foundation in Business

The English language level required is an IELTS score of 5.0, with no less than 5.0 in any one component, or the equivalent in a different qualification. Tuition fees cost €12,000 and there is a €50 application fee.

Further to this, offer holders who do not meet the English Language Requirements above can, if they wish, study pre-sessional English language classes at the UL Language Centre which is located on the UL Campus.

Preparation for University Programmes

The University of Limerick Language Centre offers a variety of courses to ensure that each student reaches their language goals.

The Preparation for University programme caters for the language needs of students who intend to study for an undergraduate or postgraduate degree at University of Limerick. It is designed for students who have reached the academic entry requirements for their chosen degree but need to improve their English in order to meet the English language entry requirement. It is suitable for applicants who have received a conditional offer from University of Limerick. Programme length varies depending on level of English.

Students who achieve a final passing grade in pre-sessional English exams will have met the English language requirements for entry to the majority of programmes at University of Limerick (equivalent IELTS 6.5). It will not be necessary for such students to take an external English language test at the end of the Preparation for University programme.

Structured and Research PhD

PhD programmes (both structured and traditional) at the University of Limerick are designed to support you in achieving your academic and professional objectives. Typically taking four years to complete, a PhD provides you with a range of skills, such as networking and communications, leadership, and the ability to publish your research findings. The outcome of your research is a thesis, on which you will be examined orally (a viva voce examination).

Postgraduate research students benefit from the experience of international researchers and the availability of state-of-the-art equipment at our research institutes and centres. UL has strong links with industry from undergraduate to postdoctoral level. The employment rate of our graduates has always been exceptional. Our figures show that 96% of PhD graduates are engaged in employment or further study following graduation.

Applying for Postgraduate Research Degree

UL accepts research applications throughout the year. The first step in applying for a graduate research position is to identify a potential supervisor and project. If you have difficulty in identifying a potential supervisor, you should complete an Expression of Interest form, available from the How to Apply section of the Doctoral College website: www.ul.ie/research/doctoral-college/how-to-apply.

Entry Requirements

- An appropriate master's or equivalent qualification that has been obtained from a University or other recognised institution
- Or
- A bachelor (honors) degree with a minimum award of 2nd Class Honours, Grade 1 (2:1) or equivalent.

Applicants must also demonstrate a high level of proficiency in English. For entry into the Faculty of Science & Engineering, an IELTS score between 6.0 and 6.5, with no individual component below 6.0, is required. For entry into the Faculties of Arts, Humanities & Social Sciences, Education & Health Sciences, and the Kemmy Business School, a composite IELTS score between 6.5 and 7.0, with no component below 6.0, is required.

Funding

Funding for postgraduate research is available from a variety of sources. Individual faculties at UL may offer scholarships or funded positions. External funding is available from Irish and international research councils, other public bodies and the private sector. The main research council in Ireland is the Irish Research Council, which funds postgraduate scholarships for Science, Engineering and Technology and Humanities and Social Sciences.

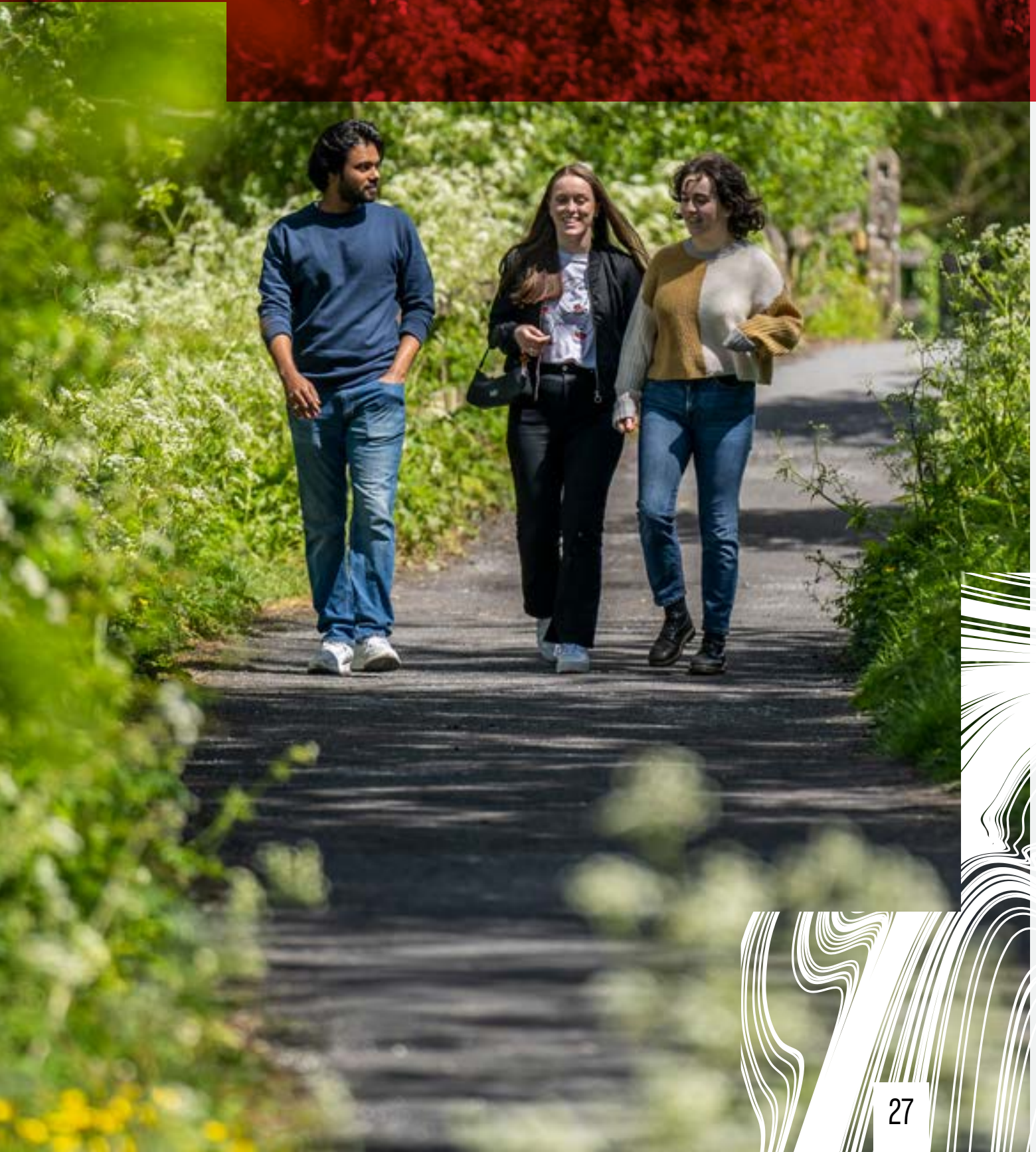
